The summer homework for AP European History is twofold.

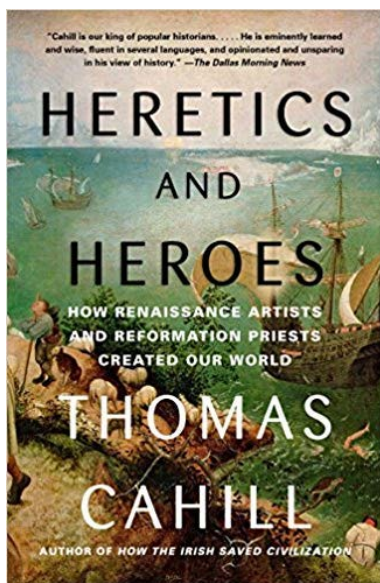
